

Advocacy. A Love Affair with Birds: the life of Thomas Sadler Roberts


The father of Minnesota ornithology, whose life story opens a window on a lost world of nature and conservation in the state's early days


REMEMBERING LOUIS DINZL

As a member of the North Minneapolis Chapter of the IWLA (now Breckeridge Chapter) Louie was one our most prominent members. He and his wife, Lavonne traveled to various places in Minnesota representing our chapter at State Division meetings as a convention delegate or as a division director. Louie was a hunter and fisherman, as well as an avid bird watcher. He spent many years as our Building and Grounds Chair. He and his son, Kurt built the eastern half of the stairs to the river. Louie was the main instigator in remodeling the kitchen around 1990.

Louis gave us a program on his experiences in the army during World War 11. He was in charge of building the Air Force base facilities in Greenland in that barren area. He gave a great account of the wildlife there, as well as construction problems on the Tundra.

When we struggled to regain membership losses in the 1980's through various methods, Louie was a strong supporter. Louie and Lavonne took part in activities that brought us to a pretty fair prominence in the League.

Those of us, who remember, feel sad at the loss of one our best. The Breckenridge Chapter members express our condolences to Lavonne Dinzl and her family, as we remember our friend and environmental conservationist, Louis Dinzl.
