Buckthorn Removal Planned

Buckthorn is one of the most harmful invasive species in Minnesota. It crowds out native plant species and can be harmful to birds (acting as a laxative). We have removed many large trailer loads over the last five years. This year we will attack the large shrubs on the river bank as well as the smaller plants that are returning in some of the areas previously eradicated. We have made wonderful progress, but because buckthorn seeds can remain dormant for five years or more we need to make this an annual project. Please join us for a few hours or more on Saturday, October 22nd when we will pull and cut many of these destructive plants. Consider recruiting a friend to join us.

WHEN: Saturday, October 22 9:00 -4:00 (join us for a few hours or the full day)

WHAT: Pulling, cutting, hauling, applying herbicide and having fun improving the Chapter. Tools, herbicide and instruction for use will be available. If you bring your own digging or cutting tools please label them. Gloves are a must.
